

# ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE, MASTER OF ARTS (M.A.)

The M.A. degree program requires 30 credit hours of graduate work distributed to assure coverage of major historical fields. The student either will take 27 credit hours of coursework, at least 3 credit hours of formal advising, and do a capstone writing project. The department also offers a special M.A. with a Concentration in Composition and Rhetoric; this specialization has the same requirements as the M.A. degree in literature, but balances courses in literature with courses in the theory of composition and rhetoric. A third specialization is designed to be part-time for secondary educators looking to receive an M.A. in English. This specialization has the same requirements as the other programs, but has additional space to take courses in education and pedagogy.
