The dual master's program in Community Planning and Landscape Architecture combines key elements of the Master of Community Planning and the Master in Landscape Architecture. Student have two options for the Landscape Architecture portion of the dual degree. Those who did not major in landscape architecture as undergraduates will be enrolled the First MLA Professional Degree Curriculum. Those students who already have a bachelor's degree in Landscape Architecture will enroll in LARC's Post-Professional degree program.
